We are designing a couple of other projects that are planned for September (at this stage who knows if they will happen!)


I am watching some of the documentaries I didn't have time for. I listen to more music that people are sharing with me - and thanks to our job we know the right people with great taste in music!

Eran: I miss the Ocean and creating live lighting for music.


Robe: Own question / answer / message of solidarity or something you'd like to say?

I feel this pandemic is a chance to try and reset the way we worked before - maybe there is a better way that is more effective for everybody!






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
